Roderick Barnett



Rod founded Salient Consulting, and first worked with Systems Leadership in 1996. clarity, enabling individuals and teams to navigate complexity, drive meaningful change, and sustain long-term success.

Recognising the post-COVID rise in anxiety among students and families from remote communities, Kellie expanded her expertise to holistic well-being. She became a certified yoga teacher specialising in trauma release, a practicing Emmett Therapist addressing chronic pain, and a qualified mindfulness coach. Viewing both organisations and the human body as interconnected systems, Kellie applies the principles of systems leadership to well-being. She emphasises the interplay between breath, the nervous system, and the brain in shaping resilience, health, and performance. Her clinic, Fluid Nation, helps clients' quiet external distractions through breathwork and mindfulness practices, fostering balance from within.

Fiona Chamberlain



Fiona Chamberlain is a C-suite executive with a record of successful reform in public purpose organisations in Australia. Fiona has had an expansive career over four decades in state, territory, and commonwealth government organisations, and has led several major public policy, operational, and corporate reforms. In recent years, Fiona has worked throughout Courts Group – Vicotria's self-administered court system – as CEO of the County Court, COO of Court Services Victoria, and

currently as CEO of the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal. Together with the President of VCAT, Fiona is leading a generational strategic change process to renew the tribunal's purpose of providing equal justice, to improve its service performance, and to make VCAT a great place to work. Fiona is passionate about developing people's capability, driving purposeful organisational change, and building positive organisations.







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Mark Allen

Mark Allen is a proud state school principal in Queensland, who is currently working in the Toowoomba Region with the branch called the Education Futures Institute in a role called 'School Improvement Coach'.

As an early career principal, Mark learnt about Systems Leadership Theory, and until very recently, is the only professional learning provided by his employer in relation to organisational leadership. Having learnt about and applied the SLT models and

tools now for about 12 years, Mark's keen interest in positive organisational culture is enhanced by the ongoing application of the work.

2012 to 2015 - Associate Consultant

I worked with and supported a number of accredited Systems Leadership Practitioners on client projects including Working Together Programs, Social Process Skills for Leaders and Systems and Symbols Audit across the mining, steel manufacturing and

stevedoring sectors. During this period, Rod Barnett and Rob Chaston in particular provided mentorship to me which played a significant role in developing my capability in Systems Leadership Theory.

2015 to 2024 - Pulse Climbing: An indoor climbing gym developer and operator in NSW As a founder and non-executive director for the first 5 years that Pulse Climbing was in operation, I then took over the role of managing director in 2015 with the intention of scaling the business.
